





Phases of play - In possession




Phases of play - Out of possession











Uruguay's verticality in attack

FIFA

Uruguay are narrow in the final third as they look to attack vertically, through the lines



Uruguay rarely broke lines by going around, focussing instead on playing through or over their opponents



However, Uruguay still created a high volume of chances from open play crosses. Two thirds of their completed crosses led to an attempt on goal







Uruguay's organised defence have kept 5 clean sheets




Uruguay utilise a well-drilled low and midblock when out of possession



Their defensive line is strong in the duel, winning the majority of possession contests



When in a mid-block, Uruguay force teams out wide to protect the centre of the pitch, whilst sitting deep to stop teams breaking through their lines




When opponents use width or beat the block, Uruguay's defensive line proactively engages them with defensive actions











Italy's verticality in attack

Like Uruguay, are narrow in the final third, with their 4-4-2 diamond formation dictating their play through the lines






Italy focussed on breaking through their opponents lines




Italy more often received the ball inside the opponent's team shape



Italy's aggressive pressing game



Italy win the ball back quicker than the majority of teams whilst also running a high distance at zone 4 or 5 when out of possession







Italy spent more than a third of their time out of possession in a pressing phase



When in a pressing phase, Italy press high up the pitch to win the ball back
